Responsibilities:

- Impact writing and reporting to show accountability to our donors on the care provided at the IWK in Children's Health, Mental Health and Addictions and Women's Health.
- Translate complex impact data into engaging and meaningful stories for donors, supporters and community.
- Develop written material for funding priorities including Cases for Support; letters of intent; and proposal writing to inspire giving as well as corresponding donor strategy.
- Support donor recognition events and organizational announcements, including
 writing speaking notes and managing media relations (pitching media outlets,
 writing media releases and advisories, preparing key messages for spokespeople,
 organizing interviews).

- Project Lead for two annual donor publications: Impact Report and Annual Accountability Newsletter - creating content strategy, writing and assisting in the project management of these publications.
- Support accountability strategy by writing donor accountability reports, acknowledgment letters and incorporating accountability/impact reporting throughout all IWK Foundation written materials and communication vehicles.
- Develop a proactive impact strategy that showcases the impact of donors on care provided to Maritime women, children and families - creating a culture of gratitude, transparency, and sustained engagement.
